Ulster County Not-for-Profits Snapshot Series: Gateway Community Industries

May 31, 2016	

Introduction and Mission

Gateway Community Industries, Inc. ("Gateway") was founded in 1957 and is a leader among not-for-profit, vocational, rehabilitative, training centers for people with mental and/or physical disabilities in Ulster County.

Gateway "assists people in choosing, acquiring, using, and maintaining the skills and supports necessary to achieve success and satisfaction in their lives. [Gateway] accomplishes this through integrated vocational, therapeutic, residential, and business services."

The agency provides many comprehensive services aimed at achieving independent and successful lives for residents, including: career evaluation, training, assistance, and placement programs; transportation and housing support; meal deliveries to seniors; non-Medicaid care coordination; and psychiatric and residential habilitation/rehabilitation.

Financial

Gateway files form 990 as a not-for-profit for tax purposes with the Internal Revenue Service. The following chart illustrates Gateway's annual budget, the amount of funds received from Ulster County Government each year, and the corresponding percentage that Ulster County contributes toward their overall budget for the last five years (including year to date information).

Gateway is governed by a Board of Directors and guided by its Board of Trustees, consisting of eleven and eight local community leaders respectively, who regularly meet. These individuals receive no salary while volunteering their time and talents in moving Gateway's vision forward. The board is charged with approving compensation and benefits for the Chief Executive Officer ("CEO"), while the CEO approves all other leadership and executive team salaries. Currently, Gateway's highest paid positions account for a total of \$378,885: Chief Executive Officer (\$125,000), Chief Financial Officer (\$98,885), Vice President of Direct Services (\$80,000), and Vice President of Human Resources (\$75,000).1

Programs

Gateway provides many programs that support Ulster County individuals as they aim to realize a hopeful, satisfying, and community based life. Following is a table of the programs Gateway offers which are funded by Ulster County
